Rebuttal focuses on #2 - cd've developed 1 and 3 more

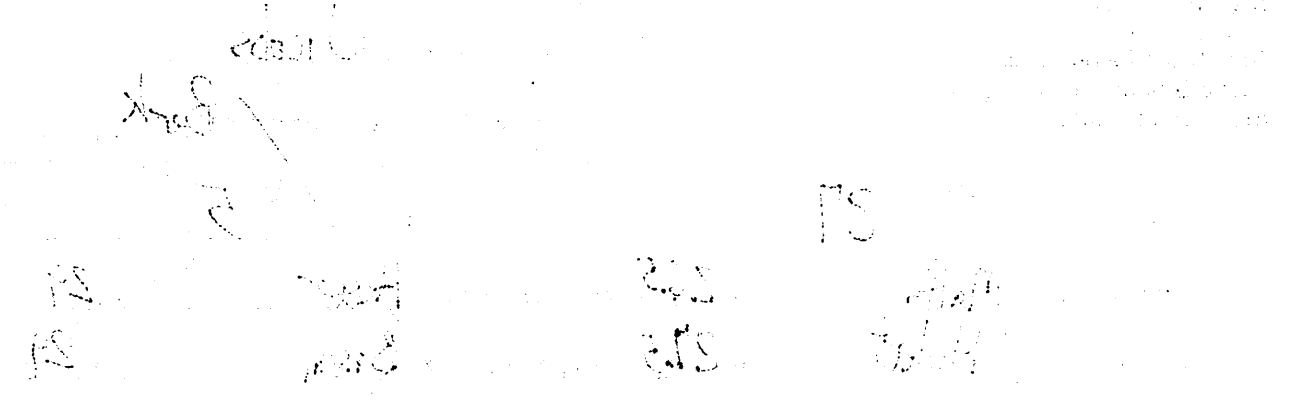

REASON FOR DECISION:

Opp establishes bens of private schools, esp. for poor. Gov loses constitutionality. Gov needs to show do a better job of establishing that (1) \$ will be diverted to pub schools (u did have ev, probably slightly goes in Gov's favor, but "who knows what Cong will do?" is a pretty good arg that Gov drops); and more importantly, (2) diversion of SVP \$ back to pub schools will improve outcomes for poor.
