Having said that, you may also want to be more specific when elaborating on your contentions as general attacks based on your points can lack impact. Your "water accommodations" point was dropped after Pro 1, but it was your best answer to a lot of the Opp points.

Opp 1: It may help to plan out your talking points as the pauses in your speech can take away from the very valid points that you are making. A lot more can be accomplished when you can use all of your time speaking on the topic at hand. Also, do not voluntarily take an extra 30+ seconds.

Opp 2: You did a very good job when it came to making sure that all points made by both sides were carried over, but the delivery was lacking in cadence, possibly due to first round jitters.
