Opp 2: Much better attempt to engage w/ Aff's contentions, than in your partner's first speech. Nice speaking style. A little halting, but this will improve w/ practice.

Thank you for mentioning judging criteria in your first speech. Then in your second speech you began by stating how you would prove judging criteria but forgot to state "preponderance of evidence" and how your case fulfilled that. Strong, passionate speaking style, but trying to minimize the significance of your opponents examples by suggesting only 2 in real world. lol fell flat when Aff 2 brought up a third example, Sandy Hook. Why did you not mention that?

Opp 2: Ugh! I hate spreading, Try to resist speed talking and hyperbole. Shifting blame to the victim of violence is not a winning strategy unless you are a defense lawyer. You have a confident speaking style but avoid making sweeping generalizations. wins this debate.
