Opp 1: *You only listed your points without spending sufficient time on each contention explaining claim → warrants → impacts. This was an ENORMOUS flaw in your side—very little explanation on your part about why I should believe you.*

Prop 2: *Makesure that when you're refuting NEG'S POINT, you link back to your points/arguments. Link back to IMPACTS! Explain why your argument matters.*
