thank you for setting up this debate as Prop 1: a policy motion, defining the weighing mechanism, but there was no rationale given for why the USFG needed \$3B for regulations. Watch language such as "other things such as that." Mention of toys/video games, but no fleshing it out as a reason to include. w/ 3:40 in first speech you had time to do so. Please bring all your papers to the lectern before speaking.

Prop 2: You are a bit soft spoken. Try to project a little more. It will come w/ time. Good refutations of Neg's contentions.

No direct mention of their plan in your first speech.

Opp 1: Your 2 disads are really contentious. The slippery slope argument is a bit hyperbolic for me. Limiting ads will not lead to political unrest → anarchy. Nice use of some evidence by ABC news. I think that was the only fact + citation in the debate. Good closing statement w/ using voting criteria - although if Opp used theirs better public health of children would "outweigh" advertising jobs.

Opp 2: Halting speaking style that will improve w/ practice. Watch hand movements w/ or without. A bit distracting. Good to note toys/video game argument not expanded by a ff. Weak argument about junk food consumed by father → not dialectic. Anecdotal evidence that isn't convincing.
