



Comments & Reason for Decision:

There was a disconnect between the affirmative and the negative. I think the negative would benefit from competition on the national circuit and I recommend sending them to the Santa Clara University Tournament on April 1st. Additionally, I believe that the affirmative would benefit from a plan focused style of debate. I recommend researching specific bills and policies that eliminate biometric scanning. Both aff and neg would benefit from a deeper understanding of biopolitics and the integration of biometrics into the biopolitical regime we inhabit. The 2A would be very successful in any anthropology or political science program in the country.

The neg loses their utilitarianism argument so I evaluate the structural violence presented by the aff first. Even though the aff provides no statistics, I trust the peer reviewed journal articles presented in the IAC. And I accept the affirmative's critique of statistical evidence as a byproduct of bad epistemology. And there are risks of data trafficking/terrorism in statistics because of biometric stuff, which corrects
