Comments for PRO debaters:

Mr. Patel be careful with your 'chain of questions' and let some ~~the~~ questions be asked of you. Controlling crossfire is admirable but you need to give your opponent space to ask questions. In rebuttal you need to give warrants especially when you want me to weigh your arguments. The rebuttal is based on assertions not warrants.

Comments for CON debaters:

In rebuttal you need to counter the job creation internal link. When you have to address it only in summary, it is really blippy.

Reasons for my decision (cite specific arguments that had a bearing):

Both teams work on giving warrants in later speeches don't just assume I will do the work for you. Pro does not respond to why rent doesn't go down due to amenities. The con cites San Francisco & Boston and only the high income will come. Also the con wins that rent rates continue to go up against minorities which leads to displacement. This is the functional internal link for the entire pro case.
