Reasons for my decision (cite specific arguments that had a bearing):

I don't buy that policy makers wouldn't be able to make a Δ for dezarizing or loosening regulations, even if it's a sensible plan because they "don't think like we do". If policy rejects dezarizing it may be more in line with policy of protection and unwillingness to change status quo or lobby interests. Both sides "cherry pick" example cities that showcase the Δ s your side would like to promote be it Portland (where my family is from) or Houston where I live. Regulations do raise costs, but there are a point to them. I would have like Neg to challenge not the probability but the merit of removing regulation for solely financial reason. I buy the filtering arguments of both sides. That it is conditional and beneficial but filtering is a 2 way street and the benefit of trickle down is going to outweigh the filtering up in a supported VRH boom. I don't think Aff is only replacing units destroyed and their Reed card was very strong support of their case. It mitigates much of the short term harm impact.




